



FAQs for the Master International Management (MEB) degree programme

When can I start the Master degree programme?

The programme can be taken up in the winter semester only. Classes start on 1 October.

How do I apply for the Master International Management?

Applications must be submitted between **1 May and 15 June** for the start in the winter semester. Please note that we can only consider applications received on time and in the required format. Please follow the application instructions as specified on the application website.

All applications must be submitted electronically through the [OTH application portal](#).

We cannot consider applications sent directly to the faculty, to the head of the programme or to the Master Commission. Informal applications will also be rejected. You must submit a formal and complete application for a place at OTH Regensburg. Applications not meeting our formal criteria will not be considered.

What are the entrance requirements for the degree programme?

The following general qualification requirements must be met:

- a) Applicants should hold a first degree in a relevant programme in international business studies or hold an equivalent German or international degree in which they will generally have been awarded 210 ECTS credits but not less than 180 credits. The Master commission decides on the relevance and/or equivalence of the degree and the equivalence of degrees obtained at universities outside of Germany in accordance with Art. 86 BayHIG.
- b) Proof of the special qualification by an overall examination grade of "good" (2,5) or better in the degree under no. 1. Alternatively, the requirement is also fulfilled by proof that the final grade submitted in the first degree program falls into the group of the best 60% in the percentage ranking of overall examination grades in the degree program at the respective university.
- c) Adequate proficiency in English. Applicants will either have completed a first degree programme according to a) that was held mainly in English, or they will have acquired adequate international experience (studies abroad in the English language) according to b) or have adequate subject-related practical knowledge (an international internship in English) according to c). Alternatively, applicants will provide proof of English proficiency at level C1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. Acceptability will be decided by the Master Commission.
- d) Programme-specific aptitude. Applicants who have completed their first degree programme "with distinction" (1.0-1.2 in the German grading system) or who can show they are among the top 10 per cent of graduates from that programme are not required to provide any additional evidence of their aptitude to be admitted to this Master programme and are thus exempt from the proof of aptitude test. Please be aware that letters written by professors or lecturers regarding performance in single classes will not be considered. The certificate confirming the applicant's completion of their first degree programme among the top 10 per cent will have to be issued by a central university administration unit and must outline the total size of the respective cohort.

- e) Applicants who have obtained less than 210 credits from their first degree will be required to make good the shortfall until the end of their Master studies in order to pass the Master examination. The Master Commission will compare the curriculum of their first degree with the curriculum of the Bachelor of International Business Management offered at OTH Regensburg to identify the additional modules still needed to achieve a total of 210 credits which the applicant is required to meet retrospectively.
- f) If the first degree diploma (letter a) cannot be produced by the application deadline then certified proof of the applicant's examination results must be presented.

How do I have to demonstrate my specific aptitude for the degree programme?

- a) To be eligible to take part in the aptitude process applicants must submit their applications in the required format and by the specified time.
- b) Applicants must demonstrate their aptitude by taking part in an oral test, and the final grade obtained in their first degree programme is also taken into consideration.
- c) The oral test will be conducted as an oral electronic distance examination, the date and duration of which will be determined by the selection committee.
- d) The subject matter of the test is the existence of the necessary basic knowledge in the subject area of international business studies of the first degree programme, particularly in the following 3 areas:
 1. International business management and intercultural competence
 2. Economics
 3. Marketing.
- e) Based on the results of the oral test and the application documents, a differentiated assessment with points is carried out. A total of 100 points can be achieved. To pass the aptitude test, at least 65 points must be achieved. The following percentages apply to the points awarded:
 - (1) The overall grade of the qualifying degree in accordance is assessed with a maximum of 40 points. The final grade of the first degree is converted into points as follows:
 - 25 points are awarded for a grade of 2.5,
 - 40 points are awarded for a grade of 1.0.
 - One point is awarded for every tenth better than a grade of 2.5.
 - (2) The result of the oral test is awarded 60 points.

Applicants who have achieved at least 65 points are suitable for the Master's degree program.
- f) If the applicant achieves the result "failed" in the aptitude test, participation in a second attempt is possible. A third participation is excluded.
- g) Applicants who have completed their relevant first degree with an overall grade of "better than 1.3" or are demonstrably among the 10% best in the percentage ranking of degrees in their degree program have provided proof of aptitude for the specific degree program and are exempt from the oral test.

If I send in my CV and existing certificates, can you tell me whether I'll be admitted to the programme?

No. Documents submitted in advance cannot be checked for completeness and accuracy.

I did not study in Europe so how do I know if the points I gained from my home university are worth at least 180 ECTS credits?

You can usually reckon that a first degree programme lasting 3 years is worth 180 ECTS credits. The programme's total workload must also be taken into account, so for example if your programme had a workload of 5,400 hours (lectures plus self-directed study) then this is equivalent to 180 ECTS credits. Remember that you must produce the relevant certificates and other documentation. Our admissions board will not be able to verify your documents if they do not clearly show the required data (workload, programme duration etc.), and you may be excluded from the application procedure if there is any doubt.

Remember that your evidence confirming the programme duration and/or number of ECTS credits obtained must be submitted in German or English language. If you do not yet have any documents available in German or English, you will need to request them from the institution where you took your first degree. Confirmations from that institution in English or German will be accepted as proof. Please note that you must submit these documents in addition to your regular degree documents (certificate, diploma).

If you fail to provide this documentary evidence and the Master Commission cannot establish how many ECTS credits you obtained in your first degree programme, your application cannot be considered any further.

How do I prove that I am meeting the admission grade requirement?

If you completed your first degree in Germany, you simply submit the preliminary or final degree documents in the OTH application portal. If you completed your first degree outside of Germany, you must first submit your degree documents for evaluation to [uni-assist](#) and obtain a VPD preliminary review documentation. You must then submit the VPD with your application in the OTH portal before the deadline. Admission will be decided based on the German grade listed in your VPD. Any grade average below 2.5 will not be considered for admission

What is uni-assist?

uni-assist is a non-profit association supported by approx. 170 German universities, which helps evaluate international study certificates and determines their equivalence to German educational standards. OTH works with uni-assist to assess degrees from abroad.

What is a VPD from uni-assist?

If you completed your first degree outside of Germany, you must submit it for evaluation to uni-assist and obtain a VPD preliminary review documentation. This report must be uploaded with the other application documents in the OTH Regensburg application portal before the deadline. The VPD contains information about your first degree, whether it qualifies you for studying in Germany, as well as the equivalent German grade.

How do I obtain a VPD from uni-assist and how long does it take?

You must apply for it directly at uni-assist: <https://www.uni-assist.de/en/how-to-apply/plan-your-application/vpd/>. Processing your VPD application can take up to 6 weeks, so make sure to apply early. If you have any questions about the status of your application for VPD, please contact uni-assist directly. The VPD process is separate from the application process at OTH Regensburg.

Can I re-use a VPD I submitted for another application?

The VPD is normally only valid for one year, however you can use older VPD as well. If you have a VPD that was issued for another university, you can submit it in the application portal, and we will check if it meets our requirements.

Who do I contact for problems or delays with VPD?

Please contact uni-assist directly.

Can I apply for the programme directly through uni-assist?

OTH Regensburg does not allow applications directly through uni-assist. We only accept applications that have been submitted in the application portal of OTH Regensburg.

I am from India and have already applied for an APS certificate to submit for my visa. Can the APS certificate replace the VPD report?

The APS India certificate cannot replace the VPD because it does not contain the equivalent German grade. The APS certificate is currently only required for visa and does not have to be submitted for application purposes at OTH Regensburg. However, if you already have it, then you can attach it to the VPD report for additional document verification.

I have two degrees with less than 180 ECTS credits, can I add the credits together?

No. You need at least 180 ECTS credits from a **single degree programme** to meet the entrance requirements. You are not allowed to add different degree programmes together (e.g. a completed Bachelor programme + a Master programme which you have also completed).

What do you mean by a 'relevant' first degree programme?

A programme is 'relevant' when it is a programme in International Business Studies. Your first degree programme should award a minimum of 90 ECTS credits in "business studies", "economics" and "intercultural skills".

Your application should be accompanied by relevant supporting documents (module descriptions etc.) in German or English.

You cannot be admitted to the Master International Management if your first degree was not business studies oriented.

What happens if my first degree programme carries less than 210 ECTS credits?

Applicants who have obtained less than 210 credits from their first business studies degree will be required to make good the shortfall within one year in order to pass the Master examination.

If you completed your first degree with only 180 ECTS credits, the Master Commission will identify the theoretical modules still needed to achieve a total of 210 credits or the experience working abroad still needed to achieve 30 credits, and specify these as criteria which the applicant is required to meet retrospectively. The theoretical modules must be completed within one year from the start of the programme, and the foreign internship must have commenced by that time.

Can extensive practical experience in employment compensate for a first degree with less than 180 ECTS credits or a grade below 2.5?

No, applicants must meet the eligibility criteria to be admitted to the programme. Practical experience cannot be a substitute for failure to meet one or more of the criteria.

What language skills do I need?

All modules of the programme are taught in English. For the elective modules in the second semester, there might be options for courses in German, but the majority of the elective options will also be taught in English. The Master thesis must be written in English.

How proficient must I be in English? Must I prove my proficiency?

Your language level should be C1 according to the European frame of reference. Applicants will either have completed a first degree programme that was held entirely in English, or they will have acquired adequate foreign experience (foreign studies in the English language) or have adequate subject-related practical knowledge (an internship in English). Alternatively, applicants will provide proof of English proficiency at level C1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

Do I need knowledge of German?

OTH Regensburg is a German University of Applied Sciences. Its official language is therefore German, which means for instance that you will receive official decisions, notices etc. in German only. You will have to show that you have a basic knowledge of German by the end of your degree programme at the very latest. Acquiring this knowledge of German is the responsibility of applicants themselves (e.g. by attending language courses at OTH or the University of Regensburg).

Please note that the OTH issues general information and notices (e.g. about re-registering, exam applications etc.) in German only. The English-language homepage of the OTH does not yet provide exactly the same content as the German version. The literature in the library of OTH Regensburg is also primarily in German language. Some English publications can be viewed online or found in partner libraries (e.g. at the University of Regensburg).

Who can help me if I have questions and problems?

Your first point of contact if you have any problems with your classes should be the programme manager. Please note however that there is a limit to the amount of support we can offer on matters affecting organisation and administration. As a student at OTH Regensburg you will be expected to take responsibility for organising your affairs.

What documents must I submit with my programme application?

As well as the official online application, written applications for admission must be supported by the following documents:

- a) Diploma or final certificate awarded by the first degree programme *
- b) Provisional transcripts of records if the diploma is not yet available
- c) [uni-assist](#) VPD preliminary review documentation, if your first degree was completed outside of Germany
- d) Certificate of de-registration *
- e) A higher education entrance qualification

* These documents can be produced on enrolment or until the end of the first semester if they are not available at the time of application.

Applicants already at OTH Regensburg must re-submit their documents in copy form.

References to documents previously submitted cannot be accepted.

External applicants are required to submit certified copies of their first-degree diplomas.

OTH Regensburg cannot give any information or support concerning visa applications.

Master degree applications must also be supported by the following documents, information etc. to allow the Master Commission to fully assess the applicant's qualifications:

- ✓ The number of ECTS credits obtained from the first degree programme. If this is not shown in the degree diploma then you must provide confirmation from your University. If you completed your studies outside the ECTS area you will need to submit documents showing the number of hours which your programme comprised (the workload). This will allow the Master Commission to check whether your programme conferred 180 ECTS credits or more. Your application cannot be fully considered without this information.
- ✓ A first degree grade of “good” (2.5) or better. If you completed your first degree outside of Germany, you must submit it for evaluation to [uni-assist](#) and obtain a VPD preliminary review documentation in which your first degree grade will be converted to the German grading system.
- ✓ Proof of English proficiency
- ✓ If applicable, proof that you completed your first degree programme “with distinction” (1.0-1.2 in the German system) or that you were among the top 10 per cent of graduates on that particular programme. If this is not shown in the degree diploma then you must provide confirmation from your University. If you cannot provide this proof the Master Commission will assume that you did not complete the programme with distinction and were not among the top 10 percent! Please be aware that letters written by professors or lecturers regarding performance in single classes will not be considered. The supporting documents will have to be issued by a central university administration unit and must outline the total size of the respective cohort.

Your application cannot be considered if it is not submitted on time and in the required format, and you will receive an automatic rejection because of a lack of documents.

How many semesters does it take to study the Master International Management?

The standard duration of the programme is 3 semesters. If you have received a conditional acceptance with additional requirements (eg. additional classes to supplement your lack of ECTS from your first degree), you will need at least one semester longer.

What are the fees for the Master degree programme?

All students have to pay a so-called ‘semester charge’ for each study semester. This is currently €181,00 and it includes a ticket for local public transport. Additionally, students from non-EU countries will have to pay a service fee of 500€ every semester from Winter 2024/25 onward.

You will also have to pay for text books and possibly for lecture notes.

Can the Master be studied as a distance learning/e-learning programme?

No, this is a full-time programme which requires you to be present in Regensburg.

Can I work alongside my studies?

Please note that this is a full-time study programme and not a part-time concept.

This Master’s programme calls for high levels of personal initiative and commitment in your approach to various class assignments and projects so you would not be advised to take on a lot of outside work during the semester.

I would need a visa to come to Germany, can you assist me with my visa application?

Unfortunately no, the large number of students means we are unable to offer any individual help with visa applications so you will have to apply on your own. We are also not able to issue any confirmations in support of individual visa applications over and above our regular official communications. Please apply for your visa in plenty of time before the programme starts.

How will I know if I have a place on the International Management degree programme?

You will receive an official admission notice from the Studies Department. Please note that this admission notice is only an *offer* of a place on the programme – you are not yet enrolled as a student at OTH Regensburg!

When can I enrol for the degree programme?

Enrolment takes place before the classes begin. You cannot begin your studies at OTH Regensburg unless you have first enrolled, and you can only enrol once you have received an official admission notice.

Once you have enrolled you are officially a student at OTH Regensburg.

You cannot enrol at a later date (e.g. in November).

Is there a checklist for applicants?

Yes!

- ✓ First degree in international business studies gaining at least 180 ECTS credits
- ✓ First degree completed with a minimum of “good” (final grade 2.5 or better in the German system → VPD by uni-assist if your first degree was issued outside of Germany!)
- ✓ English proficiency to level C1 (GER)

Only if the above criteria are met will it be worth making an application. Before applying you should check the criteria thoroughly to ensure that you meet the admission requirements.

How does studying at OTH Regensburg compare to similar programmes?

It is not possible to make sweeping statements here as the requirements for students at different institutions and in different countries can vary widely. The teaching concept generally reflects programme structures in Master degree programmes at Universities of Applied Sciences. Students are taught in small groups and are encouraged to get involved in the design of the class through active collaboration, discussion and group work. There is no ‘lecturer-dominated’ teaching that minimises student input. Experience shows that students who are unfamiliar with this teaching style may find it more demanding and time-intensive to begin with.

What types of assessments/assignments can I expect on the programme?

1. **Written assessments:** Written tests/class examinations setting optional or compulsory tasks, arithmetic problems, multiple-choice questions etc.
2. **Verbal assessments:** Individual or group presentations. These are usually to present the results of project work and seminar assignments. Presentations are usually given using PowerPoint or similar software tools.
3. **Written seminar assignments/term papers:** Scientific projects in the form of short Bachelor dissertations which students must usually prepare themselves individually. German

standards governing scientific working methods must be applied. All written assignments will undergo a plagiarism check.

4. **Preparing and defending the Master Thesis:** Preparing a Master Thesis in English language (for details see the module manual). Students are responsible for finding a supervising lecturer. Lecturers set framework topics or accept topics which are suggested by the students themselves. The topic of the Master Thesis should reflect the student's chosen specialisation area.

Can the Master Thesis also be written in conjunction with a business enterprise?

Yes, this is possible in principle but identifying a suitable company will be the responsibility of students themselves. The Faculty cannot provide any help here and has no capacity to support students in their applications to businesses. You will find offers for final year theses for example on the Job Exchange of the Bavarian Universities of Applied Sciences at: <http://job-boerse.oth-regensburg.de/index.php>.

The OTH Regensburg Career Service (<https://www.oth-regensburg.de/studium/service-und-beratung/career-service.html>) can help students with the application process (e.g. checking their application portfolios, application training etc.).

Can the Faculty or OTH Regensburg help me find a job?
